Follow Me, Not Rome

If Jesus had come to earth in 21st century America and not 1st century Judea, we may have been surprised by how little attention he gives to political battles and culture wars. Obviously he and his fellow Jews did not have the access to mass media like we do today. However, he was not ignorant of the events of his day. After all, the Roman Empire overshadowed everything that took place. The events surrounding his crucifixion make this clear.

Yet Jesus said amazingly little about the Caesars, what was happening in Rome, or how imperial politics affected daily life for the Jews. Neither did he address the ways Gentile culture had offended Jewish sensitivities. The natural question to these realities is "Why?" Maybe the answer is found in the two direct comments Jesus actually made about the Roman world.

"Render to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's" (Matthew 22:21). It is easy to quote this passage and miss the ultimate application. How much do we owe the Lord? In a word, the answer is "everything." How much do we owe Caesar? In comparison to what we owe the Lord, it's not much really. While some may reduce Jesus' answer and apply it only to paying taxes, he is providing a principle for all of life. How much time, attention, emotion, and energy do we owe God? Again, he deserves everything we have. How much time, attention, emotion, and energy do we owe "Caesar?" In comparison to God, it shouldn't be much.

Jesus' other comment on the politics of his day is found in Matthew 20:25-28. In summary, he says, "Don't be like the leaders of the world, but instead, be like me and serve those around you." Where we devote our focus will most influence who we become. Has the world's way of doing things changed you or is Jesus' way of doing things shaping you? Only you and the Lord can honestly answer that question. I know there have been times when my eyes have been taken off of Jesus. When they have, I don't serve very well, and I don't look much like him.


Rather than focusing on what was going on in Rome or how Gentile culture was changing his world, Jesus took to the streets of Jerusalem, the seaside of Galilee, and the forsaken territory of Samaria. He didn't invest his limited time on earth in being a political pundit, social commentator or culture warrior. Instead he made himself a servant to all. Thank God for that! Such service and humility allowed him to be the Savior of the world. We aren't people's personal saviors, but we have been called to follow in the Savior's steps. After all, people don't need my two cents on every issue; they need the priceless gift of Jesus Christ. Are we following him or have we become disciples of the distractions of this world? — Blaine
