Keeping Up Appearances

One of my favorite television characters of all time is Hyacinth Bucket. If you have ever watched the British comedy "Keeping Up Appearances," you know that she insists her last name is actually pronounced "bouquet." Just as there is a great difference between a bucket and a bouquet, there is a great difference between the life Hyacinth experiences at home and the one she wishes to project before others. Her life is an ongoing charade of keeping up appearances.

Similarly there can be the charade of Christianity that serves as a poor substitute of genuinely following Jesus. "How does God view me?" can quickly be replaced with "How do others view me?" When we care more about what others think of us, we will subscribe to a religion of keeping up appearances that lacks authenticity, spirituality, and God. In reality it is just another form of idolatry.

Jesus was quite familiar with the religion of keeping up appearances. Listen to his words from the Sermon on the Mount in Matthew 6:1 and 6:5:

"Beware of practicing your righteousness before other people in order to be seen by them, for then you will have no reward from your Father who is in heaven . . . And when you pray, you must not be like the hypocrites. For they love to stand and pray in the synagogues and at the street corners, that they may be seen by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward."

Contrary to how the word "hypocrite" is sometimes used, we must remember that being imperfect does not make you one. Jesus praised the imperfect people around him who were honest about their imperfections. The true hypocrite is the one who does good to keep up appearances or who is unwilling to acknowledge his own imperfections.

The joke for each episode of "Keeping Up Appearances" is that Hyacinth has fooled no one except herself. While it is a comedy, there is a sense in which the show is also a tragedy. In the same way, it is tragic to turn faith into a game of keeping appearances. Just like Hyacinth, we often fool only ourselves when we attempt to keep up appearances before others. However, even if we fool the world, God knows the truth.

"And no creature is hidden from his sight, but all are naked and exposed to the eyes of him to whom we must give account." — Hebrews 4:13

May our following of Jesus be neither for show nor unmoved by what the world may think of us. We do not need to keep up appearances as long as we keep ourselves living with, living like, and living for Christ. — Blaine
