Looking for Something Real

Today we begin a new sermon series titled "Looking for Something Real." The quality of today's technology today often makes it difficult to determine if something you see on your TV or computer screen is real or fake. I admit that I have sometimes Googled whether or not something was real.

Because so much that we see and hear today is not real, it is tempting to quickly dismiss something as fake without first investigating it. This is especially true in the spiritual realm. Many people today trust nothing connected to religion because they see hypocrisy, deception, and corruption in many religious circles. Religious leaders who use their position to prey on others or get wealthy put all religion under a cloud of suspicion. Religious leaders who entangle themselves with earthly politics misrepresent the true Kingdom of God. Religious organizations that cover-up unethical (and sometimes criminal) activity for the sake of maintaining power betray the purity and humility of the Gospel. It's hard not to blame people today for being skeptical or cynical about Christianity.

How can Christians respond to the world's distrust of religion? As in all areas of life, we would do well to first consider Jesus' example. As a Jew living in the first century, he was not naïve to how fake religion had become among his people. The Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5-7) is a point-by-point exposure of the hypocrisy found in religion in Jesus' day, and it is just as relevant to Christians in today's world.

The Sermon on the Mount, though, is more than a takedown of fake religion. It is also a call to live with authentic and sincere faith — a faith that doesn't play games with God and doesn't view people as pawns. It is a faith that sincerely loves our neighbor as ourselves and not for what they can do for us.

It is easy to criticize organized religion today. The criticism is often deserved. It is also easy to run away from all appearances of religion because of the poor examples of it. As followers of Jesus Christ, however, it is on us to show the world what "pure and undefiled religion" looks like (James 1:27). Christianity is not for people who need to look perfect, but it is for those willing to be real with God. When we are real with Him, we will also be real with one another.

Jesus' answer to bad and fake religion is genuine faith, hope, and love. May we follow in his steps and show that same faith, hope, and love to a world that still longs for something real. — Blaine
