The Power of Potential

Potential. It's amazing how that one word can contain so much promise and yet so much disappointment. Whether "potential" is used as a commendation or a condemnation comes down to if it is spoken in the present or past. Consider how vastly different the following two sentences are:

She has so much potential.

She had so much potential.

When "potential" is used in the present tense, it speaks of the hope and confidence found in a person or situation. It looks forward to all that might be in the future because of all that is possible in the present.

When "potential" is used in the past tense, it speaks of squandered abilities and unfulfilled expectations. It looks back on the past to all that might have been but sadly appears never to be.

It is easy to remain focused on the people, opportunities, and situations in life that we believe contained much potential that never became reality. Certainly because we live in a fallen world and among fallen people, we will experience the disappointments of untapped and unrealized potential.

Faith, hope and love, however, call us to lift up our eyes and see the potential that remains all around us. To my knowledge, the word "potential" is not found in any translation of the Bible. In reading the Scriptures, however, you come away with a hopeful outlook of others and all of life. In other words, the eyes of faith see potential as a very good thing. Consider the following passages:

Jesus encouraged the apostles in the potential that they possessed and would fulfill. He even said they would do "greater works" than they had witnessed in him (John 14:12). That is the ultimate confidence in others' potential!

Paul challenged Timothy to keep developing his potential for both his benefit and for the benefit of others — "Do not neglect the gift you have, which was given you by prophecy when the council of elders laid their hands on you. Practice these things, immerse yourself in them, so that all may see your progress. Keep a close watch on yourself and on the teaching. Persist in this, for by so doing you will save both yourself and your hearers" (1 Timothy 4:14-16).

Paul also rejoiced at the potential he saw in others — "And I am sure of this, that he who began a good work in you will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ" (Philippians 1:6). We can have that same confidence because our God is a God who works for good and looks forward to the future. May He who lives in us help us see the good of potential and work to its completion for all. — Blaine
