Let All the Town Keep Silent

Antonio Stradivari masterly crafted all sorts of stringed instruments in the late 1600s and early 1700s, but he is widely known as the greatest violin luthier ever. Even though hundreds of years old, approximately half of the estimated 960 original Stradivarius violins survive to this day. Some of them have auctioned for more than three million dollars in recent years.

While Stradivarius violins and their sound have been preserved until present, there is no guarantee that they will remain forever. Natural disasters, wars, and unexpected events have led to the loss of all sorts of historical documents, works of art, and artifacts. The same could happen someday to the Stradivarius, and once it is gone, so is the unmatched quality of its sound.

In hopes of preserving the Stradivarius sound, world-class violinists and musical technicians recently came together in Stradivari's hometown of Cremona, Italy to play and record every possible note on his violins. Doing so required great organization, lots of time, the best recording technology, and highly sensitive microphones. The microphones also presented the project's greatest challenge — background noise. The microphones were so sensitive that they not only picked up the violins in the concert hall but also the background noise of the surrounding neighborhood and its cobblestone streets.

Recognizing the importance of this project, the town of Verona agreed to keep noise to a minimum around the concert hall during recording, including blocking off local roads. The musicians were able to play for eight hours a day, six days a week, for five straight weeks. The project was then complete.

The people of Verona, Italy showed reverence for being in the presence of a masterclass violin. How much more is the Master of all deserving of our reverence?

In contrasting people's attitudes toward idols, Habakkuk 2:20 says, "But the Lord is in his holy temple; let all the earth keep silence before him." Sometimes we demonstrate our admiration for God through shouts of praise, and sometimes we show it through the reverence of silence. In a world full of distractions and background noise, reverential silence is a priceless commodity. We need it, and God deserves it for He remains in his holy temple. — Blaine
