Blessed Are the Children

Many of the kids among us are going back to school over the next two weeks. At Morristown we are blessed with kids who are talented academically, athletically, musically and in other extra-curricular activities. But I want to remind us all — and especially us parents — of this simple and powerful truth: Our kids are special because God gave them to us. The grades they make, the points they score, and the awards they win don't make them special; God does.

I believe in teaching our kids to do their best at whatever they pursue. However, it's also important for our children to learn that they do not have to be the best at everything. Sometimes it's important for parents to be content when our children are not the best. If my child is not the top achiever in the classroom or the ballfield, am I content with that? Moreover, am I teaching him/her that God can be glorified regardless of my worldly performance?

Athletes will sometimes be heard glorifying God when they win a big event. There's nothing wrong with that — All glory belongs to Him after all. Have you ever considered, though, that God can be glorified when someone loses? Grace and character come easily in victory, but they really shine in defeat.

Here is another important-yet-powerful truth: If our kids follow in the steps of Jesus, they may not always be the most popular among their peers. Are we okay with that and are we raising them to be okay with that?

You see, the principles of the Beatitudes in Matthew 5:1ff don't just apply to adults. They apply to kids too. The qualities Jesus described there are qualities that many people today — including young people — would associate with those who are viewed as unaccomplished and unpopular. Some may even been seen as "losers" in the eyes of popular culture.

As you read the Beatitudes, however, you quickly discover that the world's so-called "losers" are the people Jesus calls "blessed." Yes, those people get picked on and even persecuted (Matthew 5:10-11). The things they witness and experience sometimes are accompanied with tears (Matthew 5:4). And yet these are the people who Jesus next proclaims as the salt of the earth and the light of the world (Matthew 5:13-16).

Parents, as our children begin this new school year, may they see in us what it looks like to follow Jesus and may we encourage them to do the same. The early disciples were not always popular, and they weren't admired as being the most educated or most accomplished. What distinguished them, however, was that they followed Jesus. — Blaine


