Confession Is Good for America's Soul

We all share concern over the tragic events we see taking place in our nation on a far-too-regular basis. When I was a child, mass shootings were unheard of. Now they are commonplace. When they began to occur more frequently, some warned that we would eventually become numb to them. They were right.

We have also reached a place where theories explaining the causes are many and widely debated. These debates result in placing the blame for social ills at the feet of someone other than self. If you are on the political left, you blame the right. If you are on the political right, you blame the left. Everyone knows this approach isn't helping anyone, and yet it continues.

It is easy to blame the other, the person or people who are different than you. Some of the Bible's most impressive figures, however, accepted personal responsibility for the ills of their day. Consider Daniel, one of the most righteous people in Scripture, and his humble prayer of confession in Daniel 9. He doesn't blame others for Judah's woes. He consistently uses the pronouns of "we," "us," and "our." Daniel 9:8 says, "To us, O Lord, belongs open shame, to our kings, to our princes, and to our fathers, because we have sinned against you." Did such a statement make Daniel a traitor against his family or unpatriotic? Not at all. It made him honest and humble before his God. I encourage to read the entire prayer.

Similarly, the great leader Nehemiah petitions to God, "Let your ear be attentive and your eyes open, to hear the prayer of your servant that I now pray before you day and night for the people of Israel your servants, confessing the sins of the people of Israel, which we have sinned against you. Even I and my father's house have sinned" (Nehemiah 1:6).

Where would we be today if such humility was common among us and our leaders? Followers of Jesus do not excuse, justify, or condone their own sins or those of anyone else. We confess. Why do we confess? Because we sin, we are weak, and we are not God (see 1 John 1:5-10). We all need to more frequently say and hear these words: "I shouldn't have said/done/posted that," "I'm sorry," and "Would you forgive me?" As Daniel and Nehemiah teach us, we also have collective sins that need confessing. None of us are righteous; no, not one (Romans 3:10ff).

James 5:16 says healing follows confession. It certainly would be refreshing for a national figure to just once say, "I shouldn't have said that" or for those who support him/her to stop justifying unjustifiable behavior. Floodgates of healing may then open. Such figures, however, do not determine my standard of righteousness. God does. More than hearing others' confession, what I need most is to confess my own sins. Because they are many, and they are part of the problem. — Blaine
