A Better Way

We human beings are a stubborn lot. We're always looking to improve, to upgrade, to be better.

Our pursuit of better is why we don't live in caves today. It's also why Apple's latest iPhone comes with thirty-six cameras. So maybe it doesn't have thirty-six right now, but in pursuit of "better," we all know it will soon enough!

The perpetual path of improvement should always come with the following warning: Make sure that what you are pursuing is actually better than where you already are or what you already have.

For example, many families make the mistake of thinking that their home life could be better if they only had more money. As a result, life decisions are based only on numbers. Such decisions may sacrifice the more meaningful things that make a family truly family. Sadly some homes end up worse off because they had the wrong definition of "better."

Churches can make a similar mistake by believing that improving the local church happens when a congregation gets more members (or members with certain talents), increases giving, improves facilities, provides more experiences, or adds new programs. None of these desires are inherently wrong but neither do they intrinsically make a church better.

The Apostle Paul said so himself. As he writes 1 Corinthians 12, he lists a variety of talents and spiritual gifts already present among the church in Corinth. The list is rather impressive – gifts of healing, speaking in tongues, teaching with prophetic power, and leading with apostolic authority. In reading 1 Corinthians chapters one through eleven, it is obvious that access to these talents and gifts had not solved the church's lengthy list of problems.

As a result, Paul writes this sentence at the end of 1 Corinthians 12 – "And I will show you a still more excellent way." Some translations say "better way."

That sentence introduces "The Love Chapter" of 1 Corinthians 13. Paul's primary purpose in writing that section was to teach Corinth how to properly define "better" for their church. Corinth did not need more teachers, talents, gifts, or giving. None of those things alone nor all of them combined would make Corinth better. But one thing would. That one thing – the more excellent way – is love.

Corinth went through tough times, and what they ultimately needed was love. Morristown is being blessed with spiritual growth and renewal currently, but like Corinth, we continue to need love more than anything else. That's because love is the supreme virtue, the ultimate solution, and the essence of God. As we continue to grow in love, we will know and show God's better way. — Blaine
