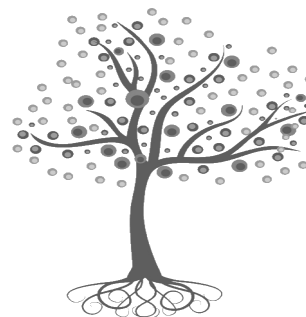

## Speak for Yourself

Speaking for others is easy to do. I can speculate, jump to conclusions, or pass along hearsay without worrying about the repercussions to myself. This human tendency is demonstrated in Matthew 16:13-16. Listen to the exchange between Jesus and the disciples. I have emphasized two phrases in bold.

13 Now when Jesus came into the district of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples, “Who do people say that the Son of Man is?” 14 And they said, “**Some say** John the Baptist, others say Elijah, and others Jeremiah or one of the prophets.” 15 He said to them, “But who do **you say** that I am?” 16 Simon Peter replied, “You are the Christ, the Son of the living God.”

When asked about what others believed, multiple disciples spoke up and a variety of answers were given. But when Jesus posed, “Who do you say that I am,” all but one fell silent. That’s how speaking for others versus speaking for ourselves often works. We too easily throw out all kinds of ideas and theories about what others think. We especially do so when we know that their supposed views are wrong. Jesus’ disciples surely knew that he was not John the Baptist, Elijah, Jeremiah, or any other dead prophet. But poking holes in others’ views is safe — sometimes, even fun — when we know that they are incorrect.

I may be right about “the word on the street,” but what I really need to know is the truth of what’s in my heart. What do I believe? What are my convictions?

The confidence of our beliefs is shown in our willingness to speak. As Paul said in 2 Corinthians 4:13, “I believed, and so I spoke.” May we do the same. - Blaine
