Second Opinions

In last Sunday night’s lesson, I made reference to a common phenomenon when it comes to seeking second opinions from doctors. While I’m sure it happens, I can’t think of anyone who has ever sought a second opinion after receiving a clean bill of health. However, we all know of people who seek second opinions after doctors give them distressing news.

Don’t get me wrong — if my doctor diagnosed me with something serious that I had not suspected, I would consider seeking a second opinion too. My point, though, is this: We rarely question information that is favorable to us or opinions that agree with us. On the flipside, we have a tendency to ignore or deny news that we don’t like or views that run contrary to ours.

As true as this phenomenon might be when it comes to our physical health, it seems to be even more true with our spiritual condition. Listen to the words from Jeremiah 8:10-11 — “From the least to the greatest everyone is greedy for unjust gain; from prophet to priest, everyone deals falsely. They have healed the wound of my people lightly, saying, ‘Peace, peace,’ when there is no peace.”

Imagine going to the doctor because you are running a fever and unable to keep food down for several days only to have that doctor tell you that you are perfectly healthy and shouldn’t change a thing. That was the spiritual situation in Judah during Jeremiah’s time. The people didn’t need a prophet or priest to tell them that they were spiritually sick. All they had to do was look at the symptoms. People in positions of power were greedy and corrupt. The people worshiped whatever idols they could find and only served God when He was convenient. Immorality was practiced and accepted as normal. Even though sin and evil were all around, the prophets and priests kept telling the people what they wanted to hear. “Peace, peace” was their way of saying “All is well; You don’t have to worry about a thing.” In truth, God was not pleased and judgment was coming.

Jeremiah lived in times of “perpetual backsliding” (Jeremiah 8:5). The people were falling further away from God, but they had become clueless and calloused regarding their true condition. They had itching ears, and the prophets and priests of their day were happy to scratch them. Jeremiah, however, spoke the truth and was persecuted for it. Second “opinions” are not always welcome, even when true.

Human beings haven’t changed much over the ages. We gravitate towards what we want to hear. Sometimes, though, we need an honest second opinion. It may not be easy to accept, but it might be the very thing that saves our lives and even our souls. Rather than seeking what you want to hear, seek God. When you do, you will never need a second opinion.

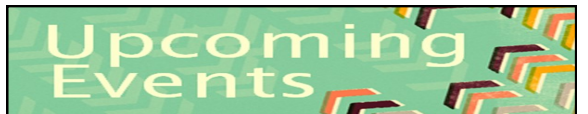
SUMMER BIBLE CLASSES: A new quarter of Bible classes begin today. Here is a rundown of our classes:
